Florence police recently charged two individuals with attempted murder in connection with a July shooting incident. Omarion James was taken into custody on October 18th and faces one count of attempted murder along with three charges related to discharging a firearm into a dwelling. Triston Davis, who was arrested the following Monday, is also facing similar charges, including one count of attempted murder and three counts of firing a gun at homes. The Florence County Detention Center inmate search results yielded "no record found" despite knowing the person was arrested and in jail. To locate them, you can try searching online or reaching out to the Florence County Detention Center directly. To find information on inmates and detainees in various facilities, follow these steps: **Florence County Detention Center:** 1. Check the official jail inmate roster. 2. Use [vinelink.com](#) for national inmate tracking. 3. Call the jail at 843-665-9944 (available 24/7). 4. Contact local police departments, as they may hold recent arrestees for up to 72 hours before transporting them. 5. Look into neighboring county jails' rosters. 6. Write or visit the jail and request information. 7. Perform an online search using the person's name, the town or city of arrest, and the crime. **South Carolina State Prison System:** 1. Search for inmates on the State Prison Locator. 2. Use [Vinelink.com](#) (a national inmate locator resource). 3. Call the Department of Corrections. **Federal Bureau of Prisons:** 1. Utilize the United States Bureau of Prisons' up-to-date inmate locator to search from 1982 to present day. * If currently in custody, see their institution and potential transport information. * If no longer in custody, view discharge date. * Obtain BOP Registry Number (inmate ID#), race, age, release date, and links for visiting, sending money, communication, and concerns. **ICE Facilities:** 1. Use the US Immigration and Custom's Enforcement online detainee locator to search by name or A-number. 2. Include hyphens in last names for accurate searches (e.g., Doe-Smith). To locate someone in custody, you can visit the same link. The A-Number must be exactly nine digits long; if it has fewer than nine digits, add zeros at the beginning. Additionally, select the detainee's correct Country of Birth from the drop-down menu provided on the page. If an alien is arrested for a state crime, you can still find them in the police jail or county jail where they were arrested. For juvenile detainees in Florence County or South Carolina, review the centers or call the Sheriff's Department at 843-665-9944. The name of a juvenile detainee will typically not be publicly listed; only their parents or legal guardians will have access to this information. To find someone in jail, you can search online for Florence County jail inmate searches, South Carolina county jail inmate searches, or United States county jails. You can also look up inmates in South Carolina state prisons. However, most jails limit the amount of information they provide about an inmate due to their innocence until proven guilty. Once convicted, more information is likely available. You can also use Google to dig into someone's past or search public records websites. One reliable website will cost only \$1.00. To find an inmate in Florence County, call 843-665-9944 24 hours a day. The incarcerating jail or prison does not have to keep the inmate in either Florence County or the state of South Carolina where they were originally charged or convicted; inmates can be transferred to other facilities. In Florence County, South Carolina, nearly all pre-trial and convicted inmates are held at facilities where they were arrested and/or convicted. However, if a jurisdiction is overcrowded or an inmate's safety is at risk, they may be transferred to another US jail or prison. A person must stand trial in the location where they were arrested unless a judge or prosecutor agrees to move the case to a different jurisdiction to ensure a fair trial. If you're having trouble finding an inmate who you know is being held in Florence County, there are several possible reasons. The issue could be with the spelling of the inmate's name, incorrect information on the jail's booking roster, or the inmate may have already been released. It's also possible that the inmate is being held at another facility or is underage. If your search for an inmate in the Florence County Detention Center roster yields no results, it could be due to a number of factors. The most common reasons include incorrect spelling of the inmate's name, failure to update the booking information or roster, release from custody, or housing at another facility. In some cases, even after being released from jail, an individual's record may still appear online. The death of a family member can be an extraordinary circumstance that allows an inmate to attend their funeral. However, this is rarely allowed due to concerns about security and safety. In the Florence County Detention Center, inmates are classified according to their security level based on factors such as their current crime, previous crimes, history of violence, gang affiliation, and jail population distribution. Public information about inmates in the Florence County Detention Center typically includes basic details like name, physical characteristics, charges, and court dates.
